now have their books to bring home. Each class will also start to visit the school library on a weekly basis where they will be able to choose another book to bring home.




Also, look out in the near future for information about our new online reading improvement programme which is called "Reading Plus."

#### **Times tables practice**

As part of homework this year, we would like the pupils across Year 3 to 6 to practice their times tables three nights a week at home. We would like them to use the TT Rock Stars website. When it comes to times tables, speed AND accuracy are important – the more facts your child remembers, the easier it is for them to do harder calculations across the maths curriculum. Times Table Rock Stars is a fun and challenging programme designed to help students master the times tables and develop in their fluency.

In school, we will be offering prizes in assembly to pupils who are regularly spending time on TT Rock Stars at home, and to pupils who are making good progress with their times tables. Your child should have been sent home with a TT Rock Stars parent letter detailing their personal login details. To log in at home once you have got these details, follow these steps:

Through the data collected on TT Rock Stars and via assessment in class, your child's class teacher will be able to monitor the progress that your child is making and will adjust the times tables that they are practising on TT Rock Stars accordingly.

# Social Communication & Behaviour Workshop
