

# Year 5 – Autumn Term – Week 3

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## Spelling Rule / Weekly Focus

### Revision Suffixes - ing, -ed and -ly

-ing and -ed in words of one syllable ending in a single consonant letter after a single vowel letter. The last consonant letter of the root word is doubled to keep the /æ/, /ɛ/, /ɪ/, /ɒ/ and /ʌ/ sound (i.e. to keep the vowel 'short'). The suffix -ly is added to an adjective to form an adverb. The rules already learnt still apply. The suffix -ly starts with a consonant letter, so it is added straight on to most root words. Root words ending in -y sounding /ee/ change y to i before adding -ly

dragged	● dragging	● stopped
stopping	● speedily	● sadly
completely	● usually	● finally
comically	● supporting	● supported
happily	● working	● worked
playing	played	frantically
